

Bell-Lloc Church

A pre-Romanic church. It has a nave and a horseshoe apse totally covered with vaulting. On the North side, under the orders of the architect from Sant Feliu de Guíxols, Lluís Esteva Cruañas, an excavation was made of the remains of a cultural building with a circular floor, joined to a narrow rectangular room which led to the church. When this building fell into ruin, a Roman chapel was built in the same place with an apse with semicircular floor. The primitive building was constructed around the 6th century; the current church, in the 10th century, and the chapel raised from the ruins of the primitive rotunda, in the 11th century. The rectory, joined to the church, dates from the 18th century.
