

The Can Llaurador lying menhir

The first documentation dates from 1677. This type of stone is made from biotitic graphite granite and this is not found in the surrounding area, which shows why it is important, as it must have been transported from elsewhere.

It serves as a terminus between Solius and Santa Cristina, and it is called the “Can Llaurador lying menhir” due to the proximity to the farmhouse with the same name and because it has been lying down for many years. It was stood up on 16th October 1994 with the help of a group of volunteers.
